About Quinsigamond Community College:

QCC was established in 1963 to provide access to higher education to residents of Central Massachusetts. Since the early 60s, enrollment has grown from 300 to over 13,000 full and part-time day and evening students served. QCC offers over 70 associate degree and certificate career options in Business, Health Care, Technology, Liberal Arts, and Human Services. Additionally, over 137 credit and 300 noncredit courses are offered online, and a wide variety of non-credit courses, workshops, and seminars are available through the Training and Education Center located in downtown Worcester. In addition to the main campus, the College provides additional programs in Southbridge, at the Senior Center in Worcester (Hospitality & Recreation Management), and at Burncoat High School (Automotive Technology).

Job Description:

Adjunct instructors teach courses within a specific discipline to a diverse student population on our main campus in Worcester and/or at additional satellite locations within our service area. Courses may be assigned for days, evenings or weekends, and responsibilities include instructional preparation, assessment of student performance and assistance to students. Adjunct faculty will attend a limited number of faculty meetings.

The Dental Hygiene Clinical Instructor will be responsible for supervising and evaluating sophomore students in clinical learning experiences during the fall, 2018 semester. The Dental Hygiene Clinical Instructors will be responsible for dental hygiene clinical instruction involving the implementation and evaluation of the dental hygiene process of care including the evaluation of clinical skills and all clinical procedures. Student assessment includes the utilization of web-based online clinical evaluation systems. Participation in in-services involving calibration of clinical teaching will be required in addition to working clinical hours.

Requirements:

Minimum Qualifications:

1. Graduate of an accredited dental hygiene program.
2. Registered dental hygienist with a current Massachusetts Dental Hygiene License.
3. Current Massachusetts Local Anesthesia Permit L.
4. Bachelor's degree in dental hygiene or closely related field
5. Strong clinical experience in dental hygiene
6. Strong communication skills
7. Experience utilizing digital radiography and computerized dental management software.

Preferred Qualifications:

1. Instructional experience in a dental hygiene clinical setting.
2. Experience using TalEval academic software to assess/evaluate student performance.
3. Experience with Eaglesoft software

Salary:

Starting rate for clinical and/or lab instruction is \$57.17 per hour. Positions are MCCC Unit eligible positions. All applicants for these positions must apply online for consideration.

Applicants must apply online for consideration by submitting a cover letter and resume for this position via our website at www.QCC.edu. Applicants must attach a resume and cover letter to their online application. In the cover letter, applicants need to tell us of their availability to work during the day and/or evening at our Downtown Worcester campus or clinical sites in our service area.
