COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Medical Emergencies - This portion of the course will provide the dental professional training on the best practices for recognizing and managing emergencies in the dental office. This course will emphasize the prevention of emergencies through obtaining a complete medical history and modifications to treatment based on this medical history. Recognition and management of emergencies will be addressed in order to manage the patient until they recover or help arrives.

INSTRUCTOR: Dr. Vellis is a Diplomat of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, a Fellow of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, Fellow of the American College of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, and member of the American Dental Association. He specializes in dental pathology, trauma, implants, and extractions.

Nicotine Addiction - In Massachusetts, almost 24% of high school students report currently using e-cigarettes and nearly half tried them at least once. More high school students used e-cigarettes than all other tobacco products combined, AND they used them nine times more often than adults. Vape pens and e-cigarettes are not harmless. They contain nicotine and other harmful chemicals. In the course attendees will be introduced to

tobacco industry tactics for targeting young people to start a nicotine addiction. New products will be explained, local policies and procedures reviewed and resource materials will be shared. Attendees will also learn about opportunities for advocacy on both local and statewide regulations.

INSTRUCTOR: Tina Grosowsky is the Project Coordinator of the Central MA Tobacco-Free Community Partnership, a program of UMass Medical School which works to reduce smoking and second-hand smoke prevalence. She works with communities to support their programs and policies, and provide tobacco prevention and smoking/vaping cessation resources for the Central MA region. She enjoys the opportunity to think creatively and work collaboratively with local stakeholders to change policies in communities that create institutional change. Tina previously worked as the Substance Abuse Prevention Coordinator for the Town of Westford for ten years. She's been practicing meditation for 20 years and is a yoga enthusiast.
